James Hoggarth was witness to Henry and Mary's marriage of 1835 at Holy Trinity Kendal. (At the time of the wedding, Mary's only brother, William Farrer, is 13 years of age.)

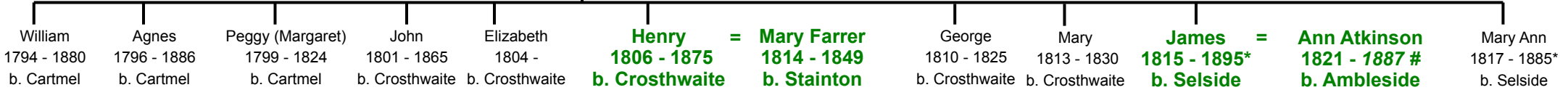
In 1851 Henry, now a widower, and one of his sons, George, lodges with his brother James and family at Coat Howe, Rydal. Both brothers are described as farm labourers.

By 1861 James has become a gamekeeper and his family have moved into Hawkshead Parish. Henry has re-married and has set up home at Ellerigg near Ambleside. James' daughter, Agnes, and Henry's daughter, Agnes, (both named after their grandmother) are House Servants to Anthony and Margaret Barnes at Garnett House, Strickland Ketel near Kendal. Margaret Barnes is a married cousin, the daughter of John and Agnes Ellwood who live nearby at Hollins Farm.

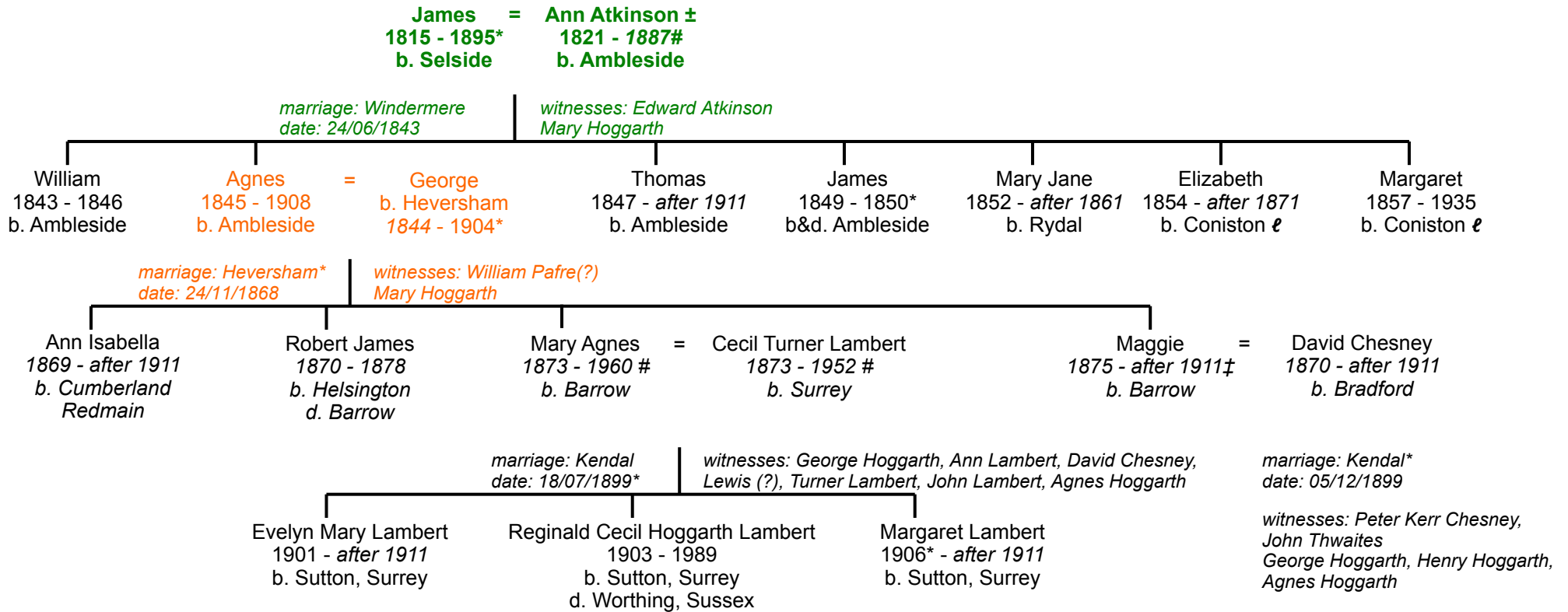

Here all 8 children were born and alive in 1911. The family subsequently moved to Nottinghamshire.

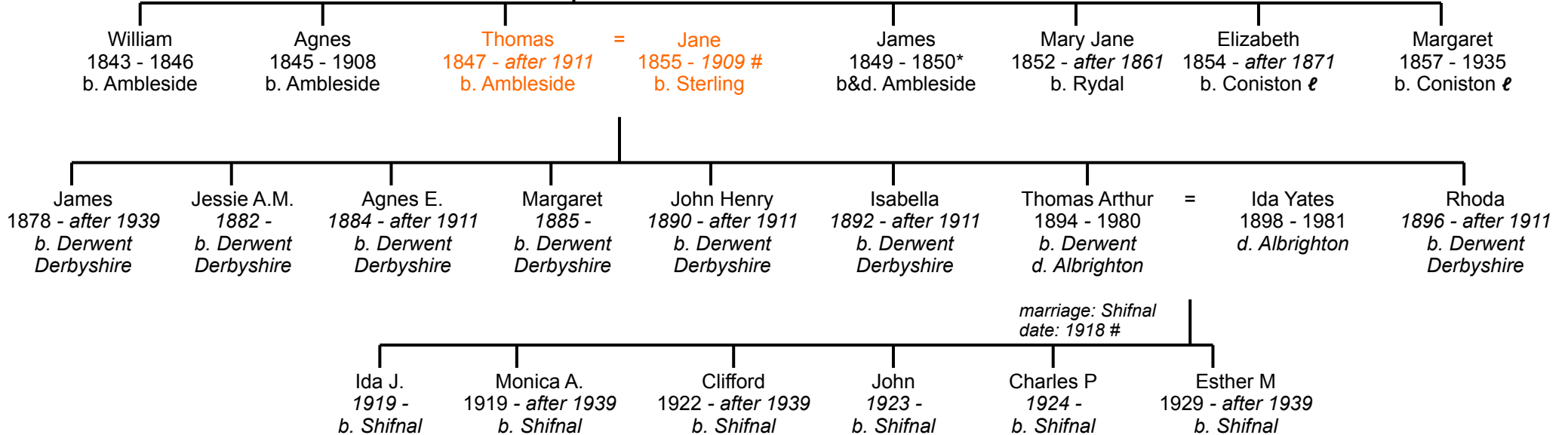
By 1911 widower Thomas was a nurseryman and jobbing gardener at Great Crosby. Agnes was a school teacher and John a nurseryman.

In 1901 Joseph and Margaret Cloudsdale are living in Battersea with their two children. Joseph is a journalist.

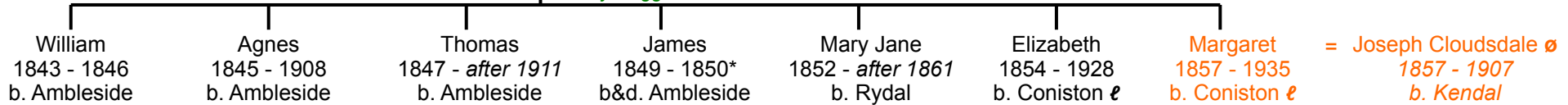
In 1911 Margaret is living at Comyn Road, Battersea. She is a manageress of tearooms. Her son Horace is an ironmonger's assistant.

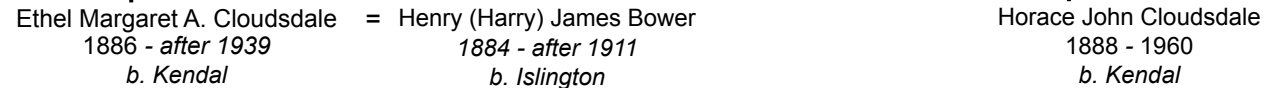

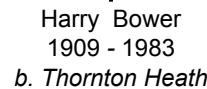
