


In 1851 John and Elizabeth are living in Wildman Street. John is a hand loom weaver and Elizabeth a bobbin winder In 1861 they are still in Wildman Street and John is a warehouseman. (Next door there is a pipe manufactory.)

In 1871 John and Elizabeth are at Meal Bank; John is a cloth finisher. Sarah and Isabella have left home.

In 1881 Elizabeth is visiting her widowed sister Isabella in Wildman Street. Isabella died in August of that year. Her married daughter, Eleanor Hill, is living at 30 Wildman Street, to a Police Constable.

In 1891 Elizabeth, living on own means, is staying with the recently widowed Michael Pickles, Woollen Manufacturer, at 5 Parr Street, Kendal.


In 1901, Elizabeth is living with her daughter, Eleanor, and son-in-law at 11 Parkside Road, Kendal. William James is a police constable. There had been two children, one of whom had died.

William Farrer is farming at Chambers House Sedgewick in 1861 & 1871 after starting married life in Skelsmergh. William is farming at Helsington in 1881 (with grandson William living in with the family) and Grange Marsh Farm in 1891 & 1901, which farm he had entered into @1887. His widow Jane Farrer is still at Grange Marsh Farm in 1911. The seven children are all said to be alive. The Wilkin family are all at home at Broughton House Farm, Grange, in 1911.

△ Field Broughton – Killed in action Westmorland Gazette - 11th May 1918 "Private Frank Wilkin. Mr. and Mrs. Wilkin, of Broughton House Farm, have been officially informed that their elder son, Private Frank Wilkin, of the Coldstream Guards, was killed on the 27th of April. During the early morning of that date the trenches held by the Coldstreams were subjected to a furious bombardment by the enemy, and Private Wilkin died by shell fire. He was 23, joined the Coldstreams in February 1917, and proceeded to France in March last. Previous to joining the army he lived at Broughton House Farm, and was a prominent figure in the social life of the village. He was for many years a member of the choir."
