


Merchant Seamen, 1835-1857, 13th June 1845: Joseph Holmes was born at Portsea 2nd March 1812. He is a coastguard boatmen, 5ft 5½in height, brown hair, fresh complexion and blue eyes. He had first gone to sea in 1825 and had served four years in the Royal Navy. When unemployed he lives at Deal. He can write.

Joseph Holmes spent his working life in the coastguard service, moving from Dorset to Sussex, to Kent and then to Morecambe by 1860.

Their only son Joseph Edwin was baptised at West Lulworth on 16th July 1837. His father's occupation is described as "preventive service". He had a sister Louisa Jane who was baptised on the same day.


In 1871 Joseph and Louisa are retired at Crest View Garden in Morecambe and he is described as "Naval Pensioner late coastguard". His son Joseph Edwin was also a "Marriner". It would be the son who is reputed to have been the captain of the Morecambe lightship.


