Jacob born 1753 was the son of Mark Crow of Burblethwaite

Jacob is farming at Pattison How at the birth of Jacob, Ellen, Edmund, and John Jacob is farming at Swallowmire at the birth of William in 1823 and in 1842 John Airey is farming at Low House, Raw, in 1861

Richard Crow (born Winster @1809) is farming at Swallowmire in 1861 & 1871. His daughter married Thomas Thornburrow in 1870.


In 1881 the widowed Elizabeth is farming at Swallowmire with son Richard and his young family


In 1891 & 1901 Richard and Esther continue to farm at Swallowmire but are at High Gate Farm, Witherslack, in 1911.
