In 1911 Isaac Whitwell was a boot finisher in the K Boot factory. He and Hannah Elizabeth had 14 children, 13 still living.






Ø Roger - horseman on his uncle Edward's farm at Singleton in 1901, farming at Low Barns, Docker, in 1911

Funeral

"Late Mr. I. W. Martindale. – The funeral took place on Saturday of Mr. Isaac Walker Martindale, a former resident, whose death occurred the previous Thursday, at Pengate, Urswick, aged 84 years. For over 40 years he was employed at the North Lonsdale Ironworks, latterly as furnace weighman. The service was conducted by the Rev. J. S. Rimmer, rector, and the chief mourners were: Miss Brockbank (Barrow), Mrs. Hartley, Mr. R. Ross, Mr. T. White and Mr. W. Timby. The late Mr. Martindale's son, Mr. George Martindale, is in South Africa, and his daughter, Mrs. Brockbank, in Spain."




Agnes - married Richard Grisdale in Kendal, 4th September 1867


