
## Stewardsons of Witherslack compiled by Ron Hoggarth October 2013



Farrier's Retirement - Mr. George Stewardson, farrier at Crosthwaite, has this week relinquished his business after practically half a century's sojourn in the valley. His father, the late George Stewardson, who died in harness some 11 years ago, at the age of 87, first started business at Underbarrow 70 years ago and remained there 22 years. When he left he took over the Crosthwaite Smithy, remaining there until his death. His son, who was in partnership with him, held this smithy for 48 years, the two between them have spent three-quarters of a century there, during which time they made all kinds of farming implements. Hooping was a speciality with them, and their clients covered a vast area, and came from far and near with their cart and carriage wheels. Mr. Stewardson reluctantly had to dispose of his business through ill health and age. He received many messages wishing him better health and happiness during his retirement. His successor, Mr. Jas Robinson, Holme, took over the house and smithy on Monday.
