


Thomas Farrer Hoggarth, born in Kendal, was named after his maternal Grandfather, Thomas Farrer, who died around 1865. He is said to have always been called Farrer Hoggarth.

A Thomas Farrer Hoggarth memorial bookmark is inserted in the Family Bible; he is buried along with his grandson Bernard in Dalton cemetery plot D120.

Dates in italics need further verification by reference to original records and certificates. Marriages of the children of Farrer & Sarah are incomplete.

Those in Red are mentioned along with Thomas and Sarah in Doris Edge's "Jottings of a Lindal Girl". William Hoggarth (1881-1917) is said to be the seventh child of ten. In 1911, 9 of Thomas and Sarah's 10 children are said to be alive.



James and Mary Agnes Gilliland are living at 4 Cheltenham Street, Barrow-in-Furness. James is a dairyman. Mary Agnes' younger sister Sarah Ann Hoggarth is also listed at the address.

From Probate Calendar:

Sarah Ann Hoggarth of 4 Cheltenham-street Barrow-in-Furness Lancashire spinster died 15 November 1942 Probate Carlisle 17 December to James Gilliland dairyman Effects £182 8s. 10d.

James Gilliland of 211 Ainslie-street Barrow-in-Furness Lancashire died 26 January 1952 Administration Lancaster 23 February to Mary Agnes Gilliland widow. Effects £917 18s. 2d. James' younger brother and sisters were born locally but he, along with his parents, John and Elizabeth, were born in County Down. In the 1911 census John & Elizabeth declared they had 9 children, 8 of whom were still alive.

Brian Edge knew Mary Agnes as Auntie Polly. She was his Great Aunt. She married a farmer of Irish decent from Walney Island called James Gilliland. They lived in a big Terraced House in Cheltenham Street Barrow in Furness.



Thomas was a farmer at Gill, Kirkby Ireleth, Broughton, West. By 1861 Thomas was a joiner living in Dalton. By 1871 he was widowed and living in Church Street, Broughton. In 1881 he is living with Robert and Mary.

Robert is a farm servant at Ecclescales, Dalton in 1861. Ten years later he is an iron miner with a young family living in Queen Street, Dalton. This was followed by a move to Lindal Bank, Pennington.



Ø Thomas emigrated to the United States, Robert & John raised the steerage plus £5 in cash which was required. A note of Doris Edge says "he did not write to his mother until the day Eleanor (Ella) married Arthur Purkiss?!"

From 1939 Register:

John, Jane, Thomas R. and Frederick W. Dickinson are living at 23 London Road, Lindal-in-Furness. John is a general labourer, Thomas is a milling machine operator, and Frederick a transport clerk. Fred and Doris Edge are living at 23 Coniston Road, Barrow-in-Furness. Fred is a sales collector. Ellen Edge is also living with them, a civil service typist.



Robert Hoggarth and the Moyle family were living with Farrer & Sarah at 14 Mount Pleasant, Lindal, in 1911. Robert & the Moyles emigrated to South Africa the following March.

Living at 13 Mount Pleasant were retired miner and widower Joseph White and his unmarried daughter Ada Agnes. Joseph had come from Derbyshire some time in the 1860s and married local girl Eleanor Thompson. His father was a Derby man and a tailor by trade.

Living at 15 Mount Pleasant were William & Ethel Hoggarth and baby Bernard.



Ø Elizabeth married James Stirkland, a Derbyshire labourer, in 1876.

§ George married local girl Margaret Riley in 1875 and lived in Dalton; he married for a second time to Mary Ann Brockbank in 1906; he and his brother, James, had followed Joseph to Furness in the 1860s to work in the mines.

¶ Ada's two eldest brothers had died by 1911. Her two other brothers have not been found in the 1911 census. There is a possibility they might of emigrated as single men. Sister Elizabeth may have married @ 1910 in Barrow.
