

Thomas Farrer Hoggarth & William Hoggarth both state in the 1901 census that they were miners and that they were born in Kendal, Westmorland.

William had moved to Furness from Westmorland in the 1850s. His brother George moved about the same time. Thomas Farrer moved with his young family from Ambleside to Furness in the early 1870s. George emigrated to Australia not long after the early death of his wife. He left his two children in the care of Farrer and Sarah.

William was a miner for well over thirty years. After marriage he and Margaret lived in Pennington (1861), Ireleth Marsh (1871) and Steel Street, Askam-in-Furness (1881, 1891 & 1901).


